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MISSION STATEMENT

The goal of the Jefferson High School Vocal Music Department is to provide each student with a unique and valuable experience in the world of choral singing. The skills of following directions, rational thinking, responsibility, self-improvement (both as a singer and as a person), group teamwork skills and high-end public performance are all taught, reinforced, and practiced on a daily basis.

This handbook is designed as a guide to the vocal music department for the student and his/her family. It contains information regarding scheduling, events, expectations, guidelines, and grading procedures. Each student and his/her family will receive a copy and **are expected to read it thoroughly.** A contract will be signed by each student and his/her parent or guardian stating that they have read and understood the expectations and guidelines of the vocal music department and agree to follow those guidelines. **It is hoped that by issuing this handbook the most frequently asked questions about the vocal music department would be answered.** **Anything not addressed in this book should be brought to the attention of the directors.**

Ultimately, students are in choir because they have chosen to make choir a part of their educational experience at Jefferson High School. We think that this is a very important decision and will work very hard to bring each student the experience they are seeking. Here's to a great year!!!



JEFFERSON VOCAL MUSIC ENSEMBLES

Any student grades 9-12 enrolled at Jefferson can sign up to be in choir. Auditions are held each spring for more advanced ensembles. Membership in any ensemble requires that certain guidelines be followed to allow for every student to achieve their maximum potential.

Varsity Singers (Bass Clef) & Amabile Singers (Treble Clef)

Open to any student in grades 9-12. Basic concepts of vocal tone production, music theory, and ensemble singing are stressed. 9th graders in these ensembles are eligible to audition for Opus Honor Choir in the fall (at the approval of the director) as well as the prep show choir, Ovation. Individual students may also elect to participate in State Solo/Ensemble Contest (at the approval of the director) and students may participate in the State Large Group Contest. Both groups perform three times during the school year. Varsity Singers meets 7th hour and Amabile Singers meets during 3rd hour.

Select Treble Choir

Open for audition to any current vocal music student in the spring of each school year. Students broaden their knowledge of vocal production, music theory and ensemble singing while experiencing and learning more advanced literature in a shorter amount of time. Ensembles perform for a variety of school functions as well as four concert appearances during the year. Members of this choir are eligible to audition for Ovation, West Side Delegation and Meistersingers in the spring. Individual members may elect to participate in State Solo/Ensemble Contest (at the approval of the director) and all members participate in State Large Group Contest. This course meets during 7th hour.

Ovation

Ovation is Jefferson's prep show choir. It is open for audition to any 9-12 grade student enrolled in a curricular choir each school year. The focus of this group is to reinforce healthy vocal production while adding the element of dance and movement; teamwork; dedication and responsibility. Auditions consist of both dance and vocal samples and membership is determined by a student's performance at that given moment. It is also required that students are available for additional rehearsals at the director's discretion. Students will travel and compete against other prep and open-class show choirs. Members are required to volunteer and work at the annual Jefferson Show Choir Invitational. Take note: Members are required to be enrolled in a curricular choir class during the ENTIRE school year. This course meets during 7th hour on Show Choir days during the school day as well Monday evenings during the school year.

West Side Delegation

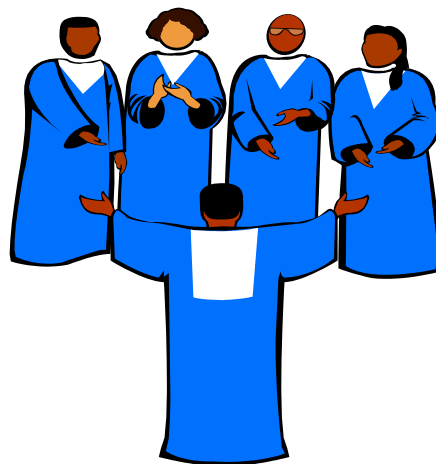
West Side Delegation is Jefferson's premier show choir. Auditions for this sophomore through senior ensemble occur at the end of May during each school year. Students enrolled in this class will learn about advanced levels of vocalization, stage presence, theatrical dance, sportsmanship, and teaming. Other requirements for this course include: extensive travel during competition season; extensive time commitment; community performances arranged by the director; and assisting at the Jefferson Show Choir Invitational in the spring. This course meets during 4th hour on Show Choir days during the school day as well Monday evenings during the school year.

Meistersingers

Meistersingers is Jefferson High School's most select curricular ensemble. Sophomores through seniors are chosen by audition each May. This group is comprised of hard-working, motivated individuals. This course offers advanced training in ensemble singing, collegiate-level literature, and rehearsal techniques. Students sing in both mixed, bass clef and treble clef choirs during the school year. Additional rehearsals may be scheduled at the director's discretion.

Chamber Choir

Chamber Choir is a new vocal offering at Jefferson High School. Comprised of sophomore through senior students selected from the Meistersingers roster, the selection process for Chamber Choir occurs by audition each May. This group is a smaller, select group of singers who want to spend extra time outside of the school day working on other vocal music opportunities. Rehearsals will be on Thursday evenings (exact time depends on what season of the year it is). Expectations for this choir include – All-State auditions, Caroling, Solo/Ensemble Contest, and other public performances.



CLASSROOM PROCEDURES

ALL STUDENTS: Our choir room is used every hour during the day, every day during the school year. With the great number of people coming in and out of the room every day it is inevitable that the room will become dirty. Please do your part in keeping the room clean by following these guidelines:

1. **No food** is allowed in the choir room during any rehearsal. The only beverage that is acceptable is water. There are garbage cans in the room; use them. If you bring something into the room you are responsible for its proper disposal.
2. All students will be provided a 3-ring binder to store their music in. It is expected that students have their music and a pencil with him/her **EVERY DAY**. Any lost or damaged music and/or binders will be charged to the student's school account. As part of your rehearsal preparation and participation grade, you may be called upon to show that you have your binder, music, and pencil with you at any given time – be ready!!!
3. **No gum** is allowed in the choir room.
4. Chairs should be set up as needed by each class. Chairs should not be leaned back on as we don't want anyone to be unintentionally injured. All classes are expected to straighten up at the conclusion of their class period. Respect all furniture in the room; you break it, you pay for it.
5. **Cell phones** should be on silent during rehearsals. If there is an emergency and you need to use your phone, please communicate this with your teacher in a calm and respectful manner. If we see one out during class, we will ask you put it away immediately. A second offense will result in a director taking your phone for the remainder of the class – you may pick it up when the bell rings. A third offense will result in your phone being taken away for the remainder of class and your parents/guardians will be contacted. Any further offence will result in an office referral.
6. Do not write on the whiteboard/chalkboard; it is used for lectures and for delivering notes to classes or students.
7. This is not a locker room; make sure you have everything with you when you leave. Anything left in the room for an extended period of time is subject to removal/disposal.
8. Please avoid scheduling every doctor, dentist, or other appointments during choir – our time is valuable, please make every effort to be here every day.
9. The director's offices are personal areas. No student is allowed in an office or access to anything in those offices without a director present (unless approved by a director). This includes computers, phones, stereos, etc. Please respect this area.

10. We have a storage facility devoted exclusively to the storage of all things vocal music – robes, show choir outfits and props, music, etc. No students should ever be in the storeroom without a director’s permission and supervision. If the storeroom is unlocked for any reason, make sure you inform a director.
11. Our back hallway houses restrooms for student use. The restrooms are used by a large number of students daily; please take care to keep these areas clean and orderly and inform your director of burned out lights, lack of bathroom tissue, or other issues.
12. We have practice rooms for student use. Rooms need to be checked out for use by a director and should remain locked while not in use. At NO TIME should any student personal items (books, clothes, etc.) be left in these rooms. Misuse of these areas could result in permanent loss of privileges for all students.

HOW TO ACCESS PARENT/STUDENT INFORMATION IN CHARMS

- Log on to www.charmsoffice.com, and click “ENTER / LOG IN” in the upper right corner.
- Locate the “PARENT/STUDENT/MEMBERS LOGIN” section of the web page.
- Login to your student’s program account using the following School Code: **JeffersonCRChoir**
- This will bring up the main “Public” page. This will allow you to look at the “public” calendar for your organization, event list, and handouts and other “publicly shared” files, as well as a few other options.
- The first time you go here, enter your child’s ID NUMBER (your student’s school ID number) into the **Student Area Password** field. You will be directed to the Change Password screen, to set a personal password different from the ID, for future use. You may also be directed to create both a unique Username and Password for the student. There are also mechanisms to recover/reset a lost Username/Password – when you create your new password, create a “hint” as well.
- Whenever you enter using this Username/password, another more detailed screen appears, with various button options for you to access areas in the Charms account. What appears here is partially up to the Account Administrator or Head Director.
- Two areas in which you can help the director/administrator maintain his/her records:
 - **Update Personal Information** – if the director has allowed it, you may help make changes to your and your child’s student information page (such as updating phone numbers / cell carriers and email addresses if they change) to help them communicate with you more effectively. You may also be able to indicate which parent volunteer/resource groups you would like to participate in, if this feature is activated. Click **Update Info** to save changes.
 - **All Fees for 2017-2018 (and past fees or credits) have been already been put into Charms.** Click **Finances**. Charms will allow you to see what you owe and can send receipts once payment has been received to directors.
- You may also see links to enter **Practice Logs**, view **Grades**, and use the **Recording Studio** if the teacher has enabled these options. *Note: We may be using the Recording Studio with certain choirs.*
- The **Calendar** may list events, rehearsals, and volunteer/RSVP opportunities. *Note: This will be updated soon.*
- Most importantly, the parent page assists both you and the teacher to communicate with each other. Stay up to date on what’s going on with your student!
- You can also download the Charms App to your smartphone – search your App Store for “Charms Parent/Student Portal” (or “Charms Blue”). It’s the way to stay in touch on the go!

CHOIR UNIFORMS

Every student will be issued a school-owned choir uniform. A fee will be charged to your school account for the use of this uniform. The fee is used for cleaning and maintenance of the uniforms. Much of what we have has been either purchased a long time ago or has been hand-made by very generous parents. In both cases great care should be use in handling the uniforms.

FOR CHOIRS WITH ROBES (Amabile Singers): Robe numbers and robes will be issued to each student prior to the first concert. That robe will then be your robe for the entire year. The robes will be stored at school for the entire year. The only exception is during State Large Group Contest.

Women need to wear the following underneath their robe; school appropriate t-shirt, shorts or skirt that is appropriately above the knee (floor length skirts show at the bottom of the robe), flesh-colored nylons, black shoes with a MAXIMUM 2" heel. No spike heels or clogs. Make-up should be simple and hair should be out of the face.

FOR CHOIRS WITH DRESSES AND TUXEDOS (Select Treble Choir, Varsity Singers, Meistersingers): Dresses, tux coats, white vests and ties will be issued before your first concert. Men are responsible for obtaining their own tux pants, tux shirt, and black dress shoes. Females are also responsible for their own closed-toe black heels or flats. The dresses issued are machine washable in cold water on delicate cycle. Dry on low setting and hang immediately. Women need flesh-colored nylons and men need black socks.

SHOW CHOIRS: You will be issued your outfit prior to your first performance. Hair and make-up will be discussed prior to performances. The proper care of these items is part of your commitment to these choirs; hanging, cleaning, de-stinking, and keeping track of your things is YOUR responsibility!!!!

No choir member should ever be seen by the public in uniform prior to taking the stage. All outfits are the student's responsibility once they are issued. Damages will be repaired at the student's expense.

FEES: All members of the choir department will be charged a nominal uniform fee for use and cleaning of choir uniforms. This money goes directly towards the cleaning and replacement of choir uniforms. *For choir robes, tuxes and dresses, students who qualify for free/reduced lunch pay a portion of the fee. Parents/guardians must indicate this on the Parent Permission Form when registering.* Fees are paid to the directors (checks are made payable to Jefferson High School). These fees may be offset through our fundraising opportunities that will be made available at least 3 times throughout the year. **Fees for Amabile Singers \$20 per year (\$10 for F/R Lunch), Varsity Singers, Select Treble Choir, and Meistersingers is \$35 per year (\$25 for Reduced Lunch and \$10 for Free Lunch), Ovation is \$425 this year and Westside Delegation is \$550 this year.**

THE PHILOSOPHY OF JEFFERSON HIGH SCHOOL'S CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES PROGRAM

Jefferson High School believes that the opportunity for participation in a wide variety of student-selected activities is a vital part of the student's educational experiences. Such participation is a privilege that carries with it responsibilities to the school, to the activity, to the student body, to the community and to the students themselves. These experiences contribute to the development of learning skills and emotional patterns that enable the student to make maximum use of his or her education.

Jefferson High School student co-curricular activities are considered a vital supplement to the school's program of education, which strives to provide experiences that will help to develop boys and girls physically, mentally, socially, and emotionally. The young people at Jefferson are encouraged to remember that they are students first. We respect their dedication to their groups and understand that they do not want to intentionally let their peers down. Attending class every day, doing the homework, and passing their classes are the best way to uphold your eligibility responsibilities!!!!

GRADING POLICIES

Your grade will be determined based on how many points you earn at the end of each term of vocal music. This policy is very straightforward and is not designed to keep anyone from receiving a good grade - it is designed to make each student, their guardian(s), and the teacher accountable for your education. The bottom line of the following grading policy is that if you show up to class on time, attend all concerts (or do the necessary make-up work), are on task in rehearsals, attend voice lessons, and have a positive attitude, you will earn a good grade.

1. **Show up to class:** You are eligible to receive points every time we have class. Since you rarely will have homework in this class, most of your learning will take place in rehearsals. Henceforth, there is no way at all to make up what you miss when you are gone. Thus, you will receive no points for an UNEXCUSED absence (since it is impossible for us to progress as a total group when the total group is not in attendance). You will not be penalized any points for excused absences.
2. **Show up on time:** Every tardy without a pass will result in a deduction of points from your participation points for that day. You are expected to be in the classroom and in your seat with your music by the time the bell rings.
3. **Be on task during rehearsals:** Simply put, you need to pay attention, sing, and not interfere with other people's learning. Your daily points indicate your level of participation. Not only will you be expected to sing when your voice part is called upon, but you will also be expected not to hinder other people from learning. In addition, you need to stay involved in the rehearsal. "Non-involvement" reflects a lazy attitude, and will reflect in your grade. You may not be distracting anyone else, but you still need to actively participate in rehearsal. Foods, gum, pop, and candy are items that are not allowed in this class. You must be ready to sing at all times, and these items do not assist in our learning. Please bring a pencil, water bottle and your music with you to EVERY REHEARSAL – this is part of your grade, too.
4. **Show up to all concerts:** Concert performance will account for 30% of your final grade each term. You will receive the full amount of points for the concert if you know your music, are on time, and perform to the very best of your ability. If you skip a concert, forget to come, or cannot attend because of your own poor planning, you will not be able to make up the missed points. You will be allowed to make up the full amount of points if you are genuinely ill, at another school-sponsored event, or have prior approval from your director. To make up the

points, you may arrange an alternate assignment with your director. The purpose of this concert make-up policy is to allow people who absolutely cannot attend to have the opportunity to earn full credit, but also to convince people to attend all performances (since these are what we rehearse for, and making them up is harder and more time-consuming than performing at the concert). Work, appointments, and similar excuses will not be accepted since you will know about the concerts months in advance.

5. **Attend Lessons:** Each student in the Jefferson Vocal Music Department will be REQUIRED to attend voice lessons (either with Directors or privately). Lessons will occur during 1st, 2nd, 5th, 6th periods and after school. If a student misses a lesson for any reason they will have to be made up. Lesson makeup opportunities will be available.

There may be an exam at the end of each semester in chorus. This exam will be relatively easy if you have attended and paid attention in class. Your music will also be checked periodically for markings. You SHOULD mark all directions given to you in your music WITH A PENCIL. We will be as professional and as efficient as possible. In order for us to progress quickly on our music, we must avoid making the same mistake multiple times.

You can read as deeply into this policy as you would like, but the bottom line is this: If you attend class regularly, are prepared and on time to rehearsal, pay attention, try as hard as you can, follow the rules, and attend voice lessons and performances (or do the necessary make-up work), you will receive an "A" in this class. Attitude and effort are more important than natural ability. You all start the semester with an "A" in this class.

CONSIDER TAKING PRIVATE VOICE LESSONS!!!!

You can learn how to be a choral singer in choir – but to reach your potential, learn to sing as a soloist, or become an even better choral singer... vocalists need small group or one-on-one work. This is not a requirement of the Jefferson Vocal Department, simply an opportunity for motivated students. *Students who study privately do not need to attend lessons with a director.*
